Many words ending in 'y' such as 'donkey' or 'baby' are difficult to spell correctly when forming the plural.

There is a clear rule to help you remember how to create plurals of words ending in ' $y$ '.

## Example:

If a word ends VOWEL + Y like 'boy' or 'monkey' you add an 's'.

One boy becomes two boys.

If a word ends CONSONANT + Y like ' baby' or 'city' you remove the ' $y$ ' and add 'ies'.

One baby becomes two babies.
